Subject: Purchase of One (1) SUV (Replacement) for the Mesa Police Department. (Fully Funded through Federal Homeland Security UASI and LETPP Program Grants) (State Contract #SCC070008-1-A2) "Citywide" contract

Purpose and Recommendation

Council is requested to approve the Purchase of One (1) SUV (Replacement) as recommended. State contract pricing was evaluated by the Police and Procurement Services Departments.

The Procurement Services Department recommends authorizing purchase from the State of Arizona contract with Midway Chevrolet at \$49,082.63, including upfitting costs and applicable sales tax.

Federal Grant funds available from the Homeland Security Program, 2007 Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) and 2007 Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETTP), which must be used while the funding is made available or forfeited, will be utilized for this purchase.

Background/Discussion

This purchase will provide the Police Department with a full-size SUV that will be upfitted for utilization as a K-9 Officer transport vehicle. This K-9 Officer will serve as a "bomb dog" for the Police Department, and will be brought on-scene when the need for evaluating suspected improvised explosive device incidents occur.

The vehicle to be replaced has met established criteria for replacement (model year 1999 with 102,000 miles), and will be sold at auction.

Alternatives

Council may choose not to authorize purchase from the State contract and new bids will be obtained; however, the State contract for vehicles is among the most competitive of all the State's contracts. It contains a "most favored customer clause" that prohibits the successful bidder(s) from offering other Arizona customers a better price for similar items without extending that price to the State of Arizona as well. Because this clause exists, it is doubtful that the City could obtain a better price by obtaining separate bids.


