Subject: One-Year Renewal of the Supply Contract for Dust and Erosion Control Services as Requested by the Development Services Department, Environmental Programs Division (Fully Funded through Mesa's Federal Environmental Compliance Fee) (Maricopa County Contract #06109S)
"Citywide Contract"

Purpose and Recommendation

Council is requested to approve a One-Year Renewal of the Supply Contract for Dust and Erosion Control Services as recommended. Competitive bids were obtained by Maricopa County Materials Management Department and evaluated by the Environmental Programs Division and Procurement Services Department.

The Procurement Services Department recommends approving purchase off the Maricopa County contract with EarthCare Consultants, LLC (primary) at \$87,236.70; Highland Environmental (shared secondary) at \$43,699.05; and International Soil Technologies, LLC (shared secondary) at \$43,497.30, for a total award of \$174,433.05, including applicable sales tax, based on estimated requirements.

Funds for this contract are available through Mesa's Federal Environmental Compliance Fee, which is currently a \$2.00 fee assessed monthly to all utility customers.

Background

Mesa is part of the Maricopa County region that continues to be in violation of health-based standards under the Clean Air Act for Particulate Matter (PM). Reducing particulate pollution levels benefits residents throughout the City, particularly those with pre-existing respiratory problems, the very young and very old and assists in the regional effort to reduce the amount of particulate pollution in the air.

Under this contract, the supplier provides and applies a stabilizing dust control product on various unpaved shoulders, roads and City-owned vacant lots in Mesa. Stabilization of unpaved surfaces is one control measure that has been found to effectively reduce the level of particulate pollution.

Alternatives

Council may choose not to authorize renewal from the Maricopa County contract and new bids would be obtained; however, if Mesa does not purchase and apply products to stabilize unpaved roads, shoulders and City-owned lots, the City could be in violation of County, State and Federal air quality rules.

Fiscal Impact


The total amount of \$174,433.05 is available in the Environmental Programs Division's budget through Mesa's Federal Environmental Compliance Fee.


