Board of Adjustment – Seven-member board with one new appointment.

New Appointment:

Judah Nativio, District 2. Mr. Nativio has spent the last five years working as a Financial Services Manager for Apollo Group. He received a master's degree from the University of Phoenix and a B.S. in Political Science from NAU. He is a board member for Symphony of the Southwest and volunteers for Mesa United Way and the American Red Cross. His appointment fills a vacancy created by the resignation of Terry Worcester. His partial term will expire June 30, 2010.

Historic Preservation Committee – Seven-member committee with two new appointments.
