

Human Services Funding Priorities

Human Services funding is available for programs that seek to work within the following priorities:

- 1. CRISIS SERVICES: emergency health and safety need to stabilize a crisis.
 - Short-term emergency assistance with food, clothing, shelter, utility deposits and payments, rent/ mortgage payments
 - Emergency shelter
- **2. PREVENTION/EARLY INTERVENTION SERVICES:** Services that prevent or intervene in cases of family breakdown, violence, or poverty.
 - Homeless prevention
 - Suicide prevention
 - Wraparound services homeless, domestic violence, trauma informed care, and behavioral health/substance abuse treatment
 - Case Management and stabilization
- **3. TRANSITIONAL SERVICES:** Services that assist individuals and families to remove barriers to obtaining and maintaining economic self-sufficiency.
 - Childcare and youth programs
 - Housing for fostering youth
 - Transportation
 - Rapid rehousing
 - Transitional housing
 - Legal and financial assistance (could include tax prep)
- **4. LONG-TERM SUPPORT:** Services that assist individuals and families in maintaining an independent or semi-independent lifestyle.
 - Seniors, youth, person's experiencing homelessness, and other vulnerable populations
 - Home-delivered meals or other home-based assistance
 - Adult day care/respite care
 - Permanent supportive housing
